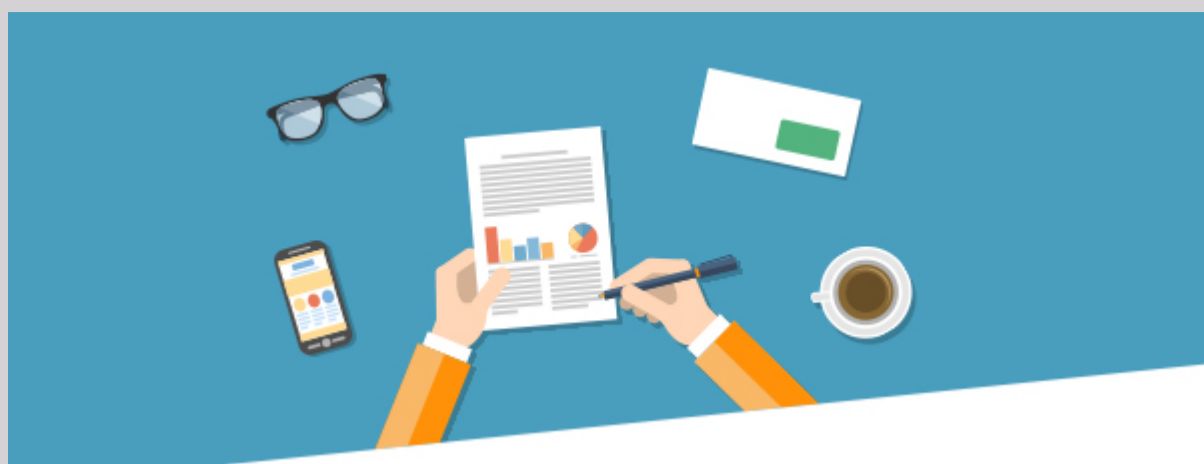


## November Newsletter

## HTFT study tips

### Study Tip 10: Reward yourself (change your inner dialogue)

### Professional values - Integrity

What does it mean to have Integrity?

The English dictionary refers to integrity as "*the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles*".

The ACCA Code of Ethics and Conduct states that integrity is "*to be straightforward and honest in all professional and business relationships.*"

Honesty and integrity play vital roles in accounting because they allow investors to trust the information they receive about companies in which they invest. Managers rely on honest accounting to run their companies without fear of biased reporting. Honesty in accounting is the primary characteristic of the profession that allows financial decision-makers to make appropriate judgments.

A professional accountant shall comply with the principles of integrity, which requires an accountant to be straightforward and honest in all professional and business relationships.

Reflect on your own experiences of where you have seen people (maybe yourself) acting with strong integrity - it is, in my opinion, the building block of all accountancy values.
